RESOLUTION NUMBER 19-R-43

A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF WAYNE BAUMGART AS THE INTERIM ZONING INSPECTOR FOR THE CITY OF KIRTLAND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the position of Zoning Inspector for the City of Kirtland; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined the need to conduct a review of the position, the qualifications for, salary and/or benefits and the duties thereof, but wish to fill the vacancy on an interim basis until said study and determinations have been made; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Kirtland Charter Article II (7) and Kirtland Code of Ordinances §1262.01 (a) and (b) the Mayor has appointed Wayne Baumgart for the position of Interim Zoning Inspector for the City of Kirtland; and

WHEREAS, the City Council agrees to confirm the appointment pursuant to Kirtland Code of Ordinances §1262.01 (b); and

WHEREAS, Wayne Baumgart agrees to the terms of part-time employment as set forth hereinbelow;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Kirtland, County of Lake and State of Ohio, that:

SECTION I: The Mayor's appointment of Wayne Baumgart, 11312 Glen Eagles Drive, Painesville, Ohio, to the position of Interim Zoning Inspector for the City of Kirtland, be and hereby is confirmed.

SECTION II: Wayne Baumgart shall be paid an hourly salary of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per hour, with the work schedule to be "as needed", not to exceed 15 hours per week. As a part time employee the interim Zoning Inspector will not be entitled to receive the following benefits; to wit: paid holidays; paid sick time or personal time; vacation time; longevity pay; funeral leave; medical, dental or life insurance. The interim Zoning Inspector will have a city vehicle available for use while traveling for zoning purposes in the city as well as a laptop computer for zoning work.

SECTION III: The Director of Finance is authorized and instructed to issue such vouchers and expend all funds necessary to pay said wages and salary.

SECTION IV:

(a) It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were passed in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

(b) This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that it is necessary to provide for the usual and customary operations of the City; wherefor, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise this Resolution shall be in effect from and after its adoption at the earliest period allowed by law.
